Each day, I pass by thousands of shrines known as spirit houses. They are in each home and place of business. Offerings are made to appease the spirits/gods and to ward off evil. Pastor's Retreat

In January each year, the pastors of our church plants take a break from their busy lives to go on a retreat together. This time of spiritual recharging is much needed. The life of a Khmer pastor is not easy. Most are bi-vocational, balancing the responsibility of planting churches and caring for the flock while providing for their families. Many of their wives also run small businesses to make ends meet while raising children and actively serving in ministry.

These retreats provide a safe space for Khmer pastors to address these challenges and open up about topics that are hard to talk about like burnout and marriage struggles. Our retreat speaker, Missionary Richey Goodrich, spoke about the importance of having spiritual friendships and accountability. Richie encouraged the pastors to continue meeting together and to share openly about their struggles. He also taught about marriage and the danger of neglecting family for ministry.

Ten years ago, there were only about 4 pastors in our ministry according to our team leader. But this year, over 70 people were in attendance at our Pastors' Retreat comprised of 2 generations of believers. The church is growing in Cambodia. Praise God!
